NCWM History

1901: The National Bureau of Standards (NBS) was formed.

1905: NBS Director Stratton called for a meeting of the states.

“In order to bring about uniformity in the State laws referring to weights and measures, and also to effect a close cooperation between the State inspection services and the National Bureau of Standards...”

NCWM History

1915: NCWM adopted the 1st standards for weighing and measuring devices.

1957: Reorganization of NCWM.

1984: NCWM adopted the model NTEP regulation.

1997: NCWM was incorporated as a 501 (c)6 non-profit.



NCWM History

1998 NCWM contracted with an association management company.

2000: NCWM became the administrator of NTEP.

2008: NCWM reorganized and hired staff and opened a headquarters in Lincoln.



NCWM Structure







