Packers and Stockyards Programs

Who are we?

USDA, GIPSA, PSP

- Packers & Stockyards Program is a federal program within the US Department of Agriculture
- Grain Inspection Packers and Stockyards Administration (GIPSA) became one administration in the 90's. We still operate as separate agencies
- Packers & Stockyards Programs (PSP) regulates the Packers & Stockyards Act that was written in 1920, and is administrative law

Our Mission as an Organization

- PSP promotes fair business practices and competitive environments to market livestock, meat, and poultry. Through its oversight activities under the P&S Act, including monitoring programs, reviews, and investigations.
- PSP fosters fair competition, and provides payment protection. It also guards against deceptive and fraudulent trade practices that affect the movement and price of meat animals and their products.
- PSP's major enforcement areas are payment protection, unfair deceptive and fraudulent practices, and competition.

Agency Goals

Inspect 100% of dynamic monorail scales for packers slaughtering more than 1,000 head/yr on a carcass basis.

Increase partnerships with other state and federal agencies (ex., currently working with DOJ and CFTC on competition case, partnering with States on Scales and Weighing activity).

Who do we regulate?

- **Live Poultry Dealers** Purchases live poultry, obtains live poultry under a poultry growing arrangement for slaughter.
- **Livestock Packers** Buys livestock for slaughter, manufactures or prepares meats or meat food products for sale or shipment, or markets meats, meat food products, or livestock products in an unmanufactured form acting as a wholesale broker, dealer, or distribution.
- Packer Buyers Buys livestock only for slaughter as an employee of a packer.
- Livestock Auctions Sells livestock on a commission basis, or furnishes stockyard services.
- Dealers & Order Buyers Buys and Sells livestock either on its own account or as the employee or agent of the vendor or purchaser.






Industry - Poultry & Livestock Packers

- Electronic submission of scale test

- Uniformity of enforcement between regions
- "Recorded Record" regulation needs to match Handbook 44
- Yield Grade investigation

Economic Impact - Beef Example

- >Assume 5,000 head / day or 10,000 weighments
- ▶6 days / week & 52 weeks / year
- ➤ Before (avg. error of .9 lb)
 - **2**,808,000 lb / year
 - @ \$1.75/lb total value \$4,914,000
- >After (avg. error of .05 lb)
 - 156,000 lb / year
 - @1.75/lb total value \$273,000
