

Price Verification Concerns from Multiple Jurisdictions

- High percentage of inspection failure rates
- Repeat failures
- Large investment of time for inspections and follow-up compliance activities
- Consumer complaints

Can we measure and quantify some of these issues? Isolated, regional, or sector specific?



Purpose of Survey

- Determine compliance rates in retail establishments throughout the country
- Provide information to weights & measures programs, retail industry, consumer groups
- Educate and inform on the issue of pricing accuracy in retail stores



Utilization

- <u>Retailers</u> may use the information as a catalyst for pricing improvement plans & staff training.
- <u>Consumer Groups</u> may use the information to educate shoppers that errors exist and how to address these at the store level.
- <u>W&M Compliance Programs</u> may use the information to better allocate resources based on store type and to advocate for their programs.
- NCWM can use this survey to heighten awareness of pricing issues and to promote the role NCWM has in equity in the marketplace.



Scope of the Survey

- Percent of accuracy/Compliance rates
- Total number of items inspected
- Overcharges
- Undercharges
- Range and average errors
- Number of stores
- Compliance rates based on store types
- Range of store's failure rates



Jurisdiction - Participants Expectations

- Attend one of the NIST Price Verification training classes, four were held
- Follow NIST Handbook 130 Examination Procedure
- Conduct at least 5 inspections per store type (except for small jurisdictions)
- Sample a diversity of store chains
- Focus inspections on the entire store
 - (all items, sale items, non-sale items)
- Do not focus on any corporation regardless of compliance history
- Include only initial inspection data in the survey*

*If a store fails an inspection during the survey, don't include follow-up inspections in the survey




Recording the Information

- Allows for jurisdictions to have their own state specific report




Overcharge & Undercharge Inspection Results Sorted by Range of Errors






Inspection Compliance Rate by Store Type
