NCWM Mission

- **The mission of the National Council on Weights and Measures (NCWM) is to ensure equity through uniform standards in a changing marketplace. Standards are set to:**
 - Promote commerce and fair competition
 - Ensure consumers “get what they pay for”
 - Foster confidence in marketplace transactions
- **NCWM is a not-for-profit association**
 - Federal, state, local, US territories, tribal, and international government officials
 - Manufacturers, retailers, service providers, and others
- **NCWM began operations in 1905**



Membership

Active Membership

- Actively engaged in enforcement of laws and regulations
- Vote on technical and business items, eligible to serve on committees

Associate Membership

- Manufacturers, industry, businesses, consumers, and other interested persons
- Vote only on business items, eligible to serve on committees

Advisory Membership

- Representatives of federal agencies
- Foreign government representatives
- Other state and local government officials
- No voting privileges, eligible to serve on committees

Non-Members

- All others
- No voting privileges, not eligible to serve on committees



National Institute of Standards and Technology (NIST)

NIST – Office of Weights and Measures

- Advisory role on committees, NTEP Sectors and Task Groups, Executive Secretary for NCWM Board of Directors
- Analyzes, evaluates, and testifies on proposals
- Publishes standards adopted by NCWM – NIST Handbooks
- Liaison with other federal agencies and foreign governments, US representative to OIML
- Develops and publishes technical guidance documents
- Conducts technical training for weights and measures officials and industry
- Operates NIST Metrology Laboratory
- Metrology laboratory recognition and training for metrologists



Measurement Canada

Measurement Canada

- Advisory role on committees, NTEP Sectors and Task Groups
- Promote harmonization between US and Canada
- Mutual Recognition Agreement (MRA) for NTEP Certification
- Valued participants at our conferences and meetings



Regional Associations

- **Regional Associations**
 - Discuss weights and measures issues
 - Make recommendations on proposals submitted to NCWM
 - Organizational structure similar to NCWM
- **Four Regional Associations**
 - Western Weights and Measures Association (WWMA)
 - Southern Weights and Measures Association (SWMA)
 - Northeastern Weights and Measures Association (NEWMA)
 - Central Weights and Measures Association (CWMA)
- **Regional Meetings**
 - Annual Meeting
 - Interim Meeting – NEWMA and CWMA



NCWM Meetings

Interim Meeting – January

- Hear testimony on new and carried forward items
- Develop items in greater detail – make recommendations to submitters
- Determine status of items for consideration at Annual Meeting
- Conduct training, subcommittee and task group meetings

Annual Meeting – July

- Hearings on Voting and Informational items only
- Vote on Items for adoption into next years Handbooks
- Conduct training, subcommittee and task group meetings, regional meetings

Other Meetings – As Required

- Committees, NTEP Sectors and workgroups, subcommittees, task groups
- Usually conducted virtually

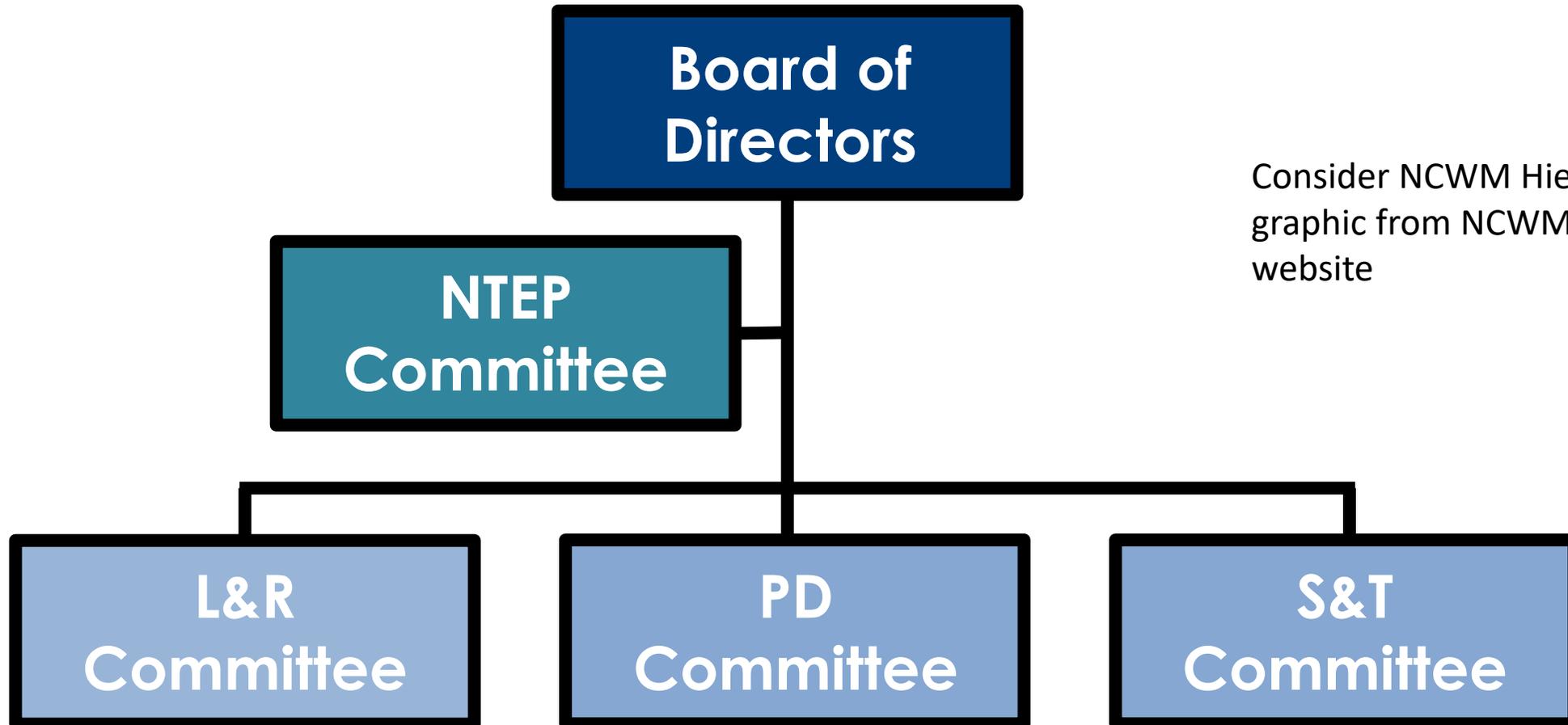

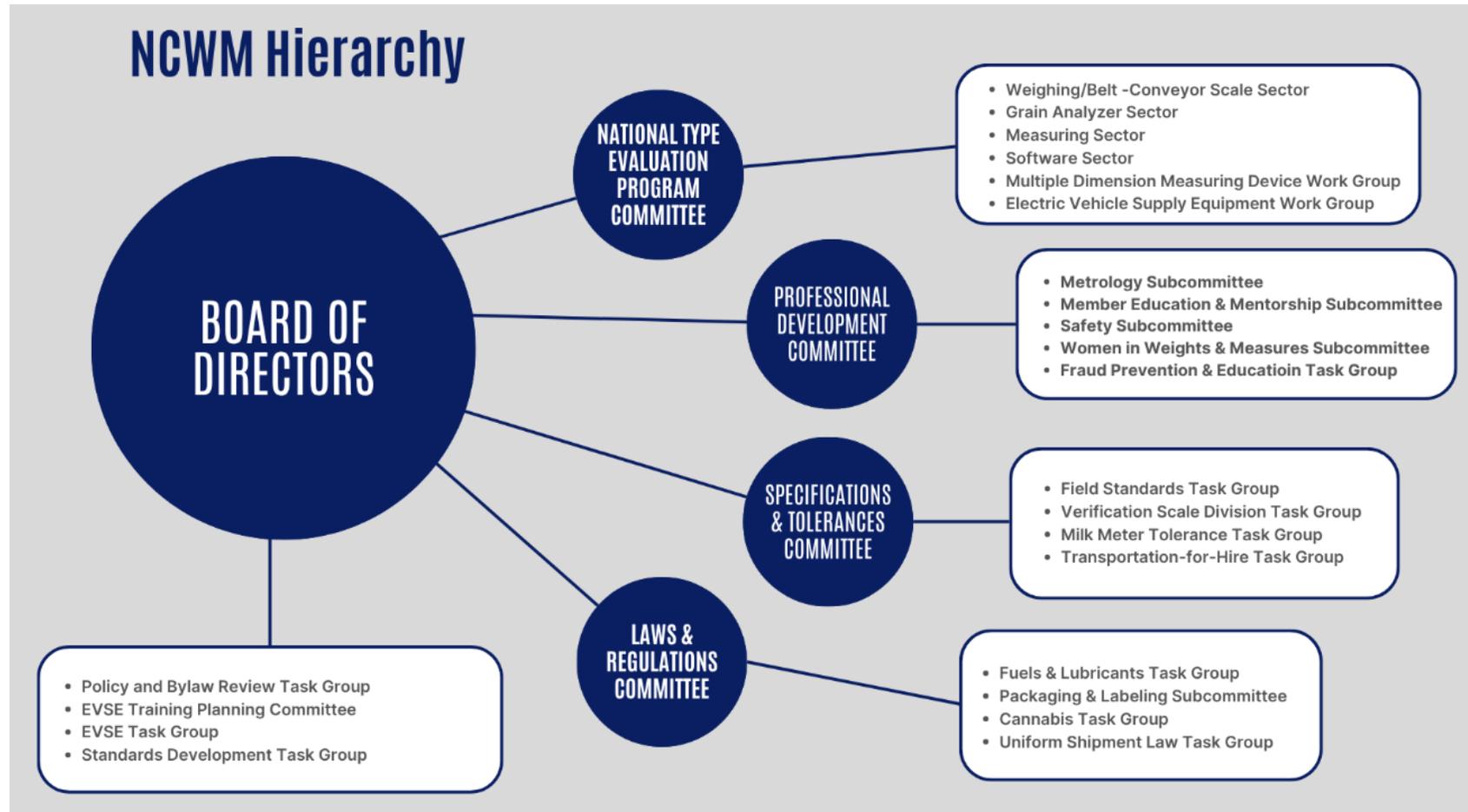

- Associate Member Representative – at least one per committee
- NIST Technical Advisor(s)
- Canadian Technical Advisor
- NCWM Technical Advisors (S&T Committee Only)
- Subcommittees and Task Groups - Support the committees



How Standards are Set

Process Starts With a Form 15

- Propose a new code or amendments to existing code
- Proposed final code language
- Detailed justification for change
- Technical data or statistics to support the proposed change
- Submit to NCWM by August 15 - Preferred
- May submit directly to regional association
- Regional may choose not to accept the proposal

How Standards are Set

NCWM Process and Procedure

- Assigns an item number to the proposal
- Submits to regional associations

Regional Associations

- Accepts item and assigns to a standing committee
- Conducts hearings – comments from regulators, submitters and others
- Conducts work sessions – evaluates items, considers comments, may suggest changes
- Submits report to NCWM – recommends status and makes comments
- Regional processes and procedures may be less formal than NCWM
- NIST Technical Advisors sometimes participate at regional annual meetings



NCWM Committee Operations

Hear testimony at open hearings

Conduct work sessions to determine item status

- Committee considers oral testimony and written submissions
- Committee determines if each item is ready for Voting status or assigns another status
- Only committee members can participate in discussions
- Committee chair may request comments for clarification from the submitter
- Others may attend the work session

The committee may request items be assigned to a task group or subcommittee

- NCWM Board Chair approves or disapproves

The committee is not responsible for fully developing an item

The committee may change status of an item until voting begins



Item Status

- **VOTING (V)**
 - Item is fully developed and ready for vote
- **INFORMATIONAL (I)**
 - Item has merit and the committee will take ownership for further development
- **DEVELOPING (D)**
 - Item has merit but will be returned to the submitter or a task group for further development
- **WITHDRAWN (W)**
 - Item does not have merit or support and will be removed from the agenda
- **ASSIGNED (A)**
 - Item has been assigned to a subcommittee or task group typically consisting of subject matter experts for further development



Meetings - Open Hearings

Your Opportunity to Testify or Make a Presentation

- Interim Meeting – testimony on all items
- Annual Meeting – testimony on Informational and Voting status items only
- Must have Committee approval to make a presentation (10 minute limit)

Written Testimony

- You do not need to be present to submit written materials
- Letters and technical data may be submitted before meetings
- See NCWM Policy 2.4.5. for more information



Meetings - Open Hearings

Testimony

- Comments limited to 5 minutes
- Follow-up comments may be made after other attendees have testified

Protocol

- Approach the Microphone, wait to be recognized by Committee Chair
- State your name and who you represent
- Make your comments
- For extensive or complex comments, be prepared to submit a written version to the committee



Committee Work Sessions

Anyone May Listen to Committee Deliberations

Schedule

- Monday and Tuesday afternoons
- Times are as scheduled or as announced by committee chair
- Usually announced at official sessions and on Yapp App

Rules and Processes

- Sessions are not open for new or repeated testimony
- Observers are not allowed to participate unless requested by the committee
- The Committee comments and recommendations are published and available Tuesday evening or Wednesday morning



Voting

Voting is Conducted at Annual Meeting

- Held on Wednesday and sometimes extends to Thursday
- Voting items appear with a “V” on the Committee agendas
- Items may be grouped in a block for efficiency

Two House Voting System

- House of Representatives - all state directors, representatives of U.S. Territories, and Native American Tribal representatives
- House of Delegates - all other Active Members
- Must be present to vote – quorum in each house is required

Addendum Sheets Published Tuesday Evening

- Sheets show changes in status and final amendments



Voting Session

A presiding officer and committees conduct the voting session

- Roberts Rules of Order are used during the voting session
- Committees may change item status prior to voting
- Testimony and amendments are allowed during the voting session
- An item may be removed from the block at request of a member

Voting

- To pass in the House of Representatives there needs to be a majority vote with a minimum of 27 votes
- To pass in the House of Delegates a simple majority is required.
- An item or block must pass both houses to be adopted



Voting Session

Passed Items

- Submitted to NIST for publication in the Handbooks
- NIST may make minor edits
- Handbooks are effective January 1

Failed Items

- Withdrawn – submitter may resubmit next year
- May be returned to committee for further consideration
