## 2019 Safety Survey (Covering 2018)

Participation about the same as 2018 survey

- 15 states
- 9 counties or municipalities

Days Away/Restricted Time (DART) slightly higher but better than 2016(5.6) and 2017 (5.4)

- 1.7 on 2019 survey compared to 1.2 on 2018 survey
- Range from 0.0 to 6.1
- 16 jurisdictions reported no DART injuries last year





#### Hazards Causing Injuries

No slips, trips or falls reported this year. Lifting/bending/twisting still top cause of injuries.

## Disconnect between Events & Programs

- 10 jurisdictions with DART injuries or property damage or both
- Only 4 made any changes in response (and a 5<sup>th</sup> indicated intention to do something but hadn't done anything yet)
- 8 jurisdictions reported new safety programs but did not link them to incidents or property damage
- No correlation between number of programs offered and whether jurisdictions observed incidents



On average, jurisdictions reported offering 7 types of safety training.

Fifty percent or more offered the courses below:
